VNA prioritizes safety, comfort and dignity of patients in their familiar surroundings, while supporting families through this critical time. Benefits of Hospice

Circle of Care: each patient's multidisciplinary care team includes a medical director, RN, CNA, social worker, and chaplain offering individualized medical, social, and spiritual support.

Hospice is an extension of your care

- Hospice staff is on call 24/7 to support physicians and families
- Additional support for patients and families at a critical phase
- Seamless care coordination across healthcare settings and reduction of hospital re-admittance

Specialized end-of-life care for patients & families

- Pain & symptom management to prioritize quality of life
- Education for patients & families on what to expect in the course of the disease and how to provide basic care
- Durable Medical Equipment (DME) based on diagnosis and other support services like transportation

Inpatient Unit

New 15-bed facility at PHMC Public Health Campus on Cedar in West Philadelphia.

- Respite services for caregiver relief

Eligibility

- A patient has a six-month, disease-specific diagnosis
- An illness is not responding to curative treatment, or a patient decides they no longer want to pursue curative treatment
- It's ideal to refer patients before they go to the hospital
- If you're unsure about a hospice referral, VNA is available to complete an evaluation

The Hospice Conversation


- Hospice options can alleviate the pressure of the topic for physicians and families, and lessen the burden of uncertainty

VNA's Hospice Inpatient Unit lives within the PHMC Public Health Campus on Cedar, an innovative and integrated public health campus designed to serve the West and Southwest Philadelphia communities. The Campus offers primary care through the PHMC Health Center on Cedar, a Federally Qualified Health Center serving adults and children. The Campus also provides a host of additional programs, including an Emergency Department, inpatient hospital care and psychiatric care by the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania and other services provided in the near future by the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.
